Composer Biography

Dom Refuerzo (often stylized as dom refuerzo) is a senior at Emory studying music composition and math. Their first composition opportunity came in their senior year of high school, when they co-wrote a one-act musical and had it performed at their school's one-act festival. More recently, they have contributed to the music life at Emory by performing with the Sound and Colour Collective, the StageWorks ensemble, and the University Chorus. They have also taken on principal roles in several musical theater productions on campus, acting as Jeanette Valmy in No Strings and Hetaira in Lysistrata Jones. In summer 2018, Refuerzo was a musical theater camp intern at the Broadway Center for the Performing Arts in Tacoma, Washington. In summer 2019, they were one of 40 participants in the Walden School's Creative Musicians Retreat in Dublin, New Hampshire. Their main artistic endeavors for the 2019–2020 academic year are through chaiTunes a cappella and the honors department. In chaiTunes, Refuerzo is the main vocal percussionist. They also serve as the group's music director after having served as secretary last year. In the honors department, Refuerzo is completing a thesis in music by composing an hour of original pieces for this recital. This past January, Refuerzo received the Emory University Creativity & Arts Undergraduate Student Award, which is presented annually to a student who supports development, accessibility, inclusion, and innovation in the arts. With this recital, Refuerzo wants to encourage music focuses—performance, research, of different people composition, and all else—to collaborate for years to come. Their next goal is to attend a graduate musical theater writing program after taking a couple of years off of school. As they prepare to finish their time at Emory, Refuerzo's main hope is to never stop creating art, no matter the medium. But music . . . it beckons!


